Pupil Premium

At Galley Common Infant School we are committed to promoting the progress and attainment of all our pupils, whatever their backgrounds.

The Pupil Premium Grant

Galley Common Infant School received a total of £22,700 for the period of September 2016 to August 2017 as a direct grant from the DFE.

During the academic year approximately 7% of Galley Common Infant School children received free school meals. Listed below is a series of bullet points detailing how this funding has been allocated to Free School Meals (FSM) children:

- All classes in our school have additional support for 5 mornings and an afternoon per week. In Reception the classes have full time support. This ensures that the needs of our pupils can be met in small groups;
- Our Higher Level Teaching Assistant provides intervention support for any children not making expected progress or reaching the national levels of attainment.
- We provide support for children in reading using the Better Reading Support programme which is delivered by trained teaching assistants throughout the year.
- We have a tracking system which enables us to track the progress of attainment of children in Reading, Writing and Mathematics on a termly basis. This is analysed to ensure that all children, whatever their backgrounds are able to access the curriculum and are making good or outstanding progress in their learning;
- We provide after school clubs, some of which are free of charge, trips and visitors to enrich
 the curriculum and make sure that all children have additional learning experiences outside
 the classroom.
- We have introduced the First Class @ Number scheme which supports those children needing additional support in maths.
- We have provided funding for those children eligible for free school meals to take part in after school clubs free of charge (up to £50 per child per year).
- In Reception (and Year 1) staff are trained in Time to Talk and we have a speech and language champion.
- We have a nurture group run by two trained Teaching Assistants 3 afternoons per week.
- We have a "Friendly Group" which supports girls self esteem.

Reading

In Year 1, 3-4 out of 5 children were working below age related expectations and on average this was still the case by July 2017 although children have made progress from their starting points. Data shows that some disadvantaged children made expected progress in reading. One child left in the Spring term.

In Year 2 all children made at least expected progress from their starting points. 1 child exceeded expectations.

Phonics

In Year 1, 3 out of 5 Pupil Premium children achieved the Phonics Screen check

In Year 2, 4 out of 6 Pupil Premium children achieved the Phonics screen check retake. The two children who did not meet the standards have Special Educational Needs.

Writing

In Year 1, 3 out of 5 Pupil Premium children were working below age related expectations. All children made satisfactory progress from their starting points. 2 children making above expected progress in the Spring term.

4 out of 6 children were working at below the expected standards. 2 of these children made below expected progress – both children received 1:1 support to help develop their writing. 1 child made expected progress and 1 child made above expected progress.

Maths

In Year 1, 4 out of 6 Pupil Premium children were working below age related expectations. This has decreased to only two children working below age related expectations, showing a good level of progress in Year 1. All children made at least expected progress, however, one child did not make expected progress in the Spring term.

In Year 2, all 6 children met their target and made good progress. 1 child made above expected progress.
